This is a difficult chapter to interpret. There are two major views.

First View: the verses are to be taken literally. The temple will be rebuilt, two actual witnesses will appear, and sacrifice at the temple will begin again.

Second View: the verses are symbolic. The temple is the church, the witnesses are the church which must suffer martyrdom, and the great city represents civilization utterly alien to the will of God. This chapter represents the little book of Revelation 10, sweet to the taste, but bitter to the stomach.

They have power to shut the sky so that no rain will fall for as long as they prophesy. A holiday is declared because the witness of the church has been silenced. The torment against their wicked conscience is no more. John 16:20
But after three and a half days, God breathed life into them, and they stood up! Terror struck all who were staring at them.	 Breathing the breath of life into the church is similar to the vision of the Valley of Dry Bones in Ezekiel 37 The resurrection of the church shows that God has the ultimate power over life and death Terror strikes the world since they cannot stop the church
Then a loud voice from heaven called to the two prophets, "Come up here!" And they rose to heaven in a cloud as their enemies watched.	 The triumph of the church is witnessed by all God calls the church to him in heaven and they go up to heaven in a cloud This is reminiscent of the disciples watching Jesus go up to heaven, but here it is the enemies of God that see the church triumphant
At the same time there was a terrible earthquake that destroyed a tenth of the city. Seven thousand people died in that earthquake, and everyone else was terrified and gave glory to the	 Ezekiel 38:17-23 God will show His Sovereign Power Zechariah 14:11-21 A portion 1/10th are destroyed which results in terror and acknowledging that God is all powerful.

The second terror is past, but look, the third terror is coming quickly.	Here the third woe is coming
